BEYOND COMPASSIONATE RELEASE: CHALLENGING EXCESSIVE SENTENCES IN THE COURTS

(TARPON KEY ROOM)

Federal law strictly limits courts from revisiting and lowering finalized sentences. One narrow exception is for compassionate release under 18 U.S.C.§ 3582(c)(1)(A). Until the First Step Act of 2018, only the BOP could bring a compassionate release motion. The Act reformed compassionate release by permitting judges to revisit sentences upon motion of the defendant. The panel will explore the rapid evolution of compassionate release from a way to free medically vulnerable people to a powerful tool in the hands of litigators seeking the release of those serving extreme mandatory minimum sentences that can no longer be imposed today. Panelists will discuss the current lay of the land, share litigation tips, and discuss best practices in working with individuals securing a freedom they did not expect to occur for years, decades, or ever.
